



A group of pupils from Ysgol Maes y Gwendraeth, Cefneithin have begun a 'Tallest Buildings Challenge' to raise funds for the Salvation Army.

Under a scheme purposed by the Prince's Trust the group has to climb the equivalent of the world's 30 tallest buildings using the step-by-step fitness equipment provided by Snap Fitness, Cross Hands.
